

How to Download MP3s to Your Computer/Laptop and Android Phone

Written Instructions to Download MP3

The MP3 download will arrive in your email as a link. Right-click on the download link. Select "save link as" and choose a location where you want to put the MP3s on the hard drive of your computer/laptop. To play the file from your computer/laptop, locate the MP3 on the hard drive and double click on the MP3.

How to Transfer the MP3s from Your Computer/Laptop to an Android Phone

To transfer the MP3, first connect your phone to your computer using a USB cable. Once you plug the cable into your phone and computer, you will see a USB icon in the menu bar on your phone.

Drag the menu bar down and you will uncover a "USB Connected" message. When you tap this message, a dialog box will pop up asking "Mount" or "Don't Mount." You want to select "Mount" which will transfer MP3s from your computer to your phone's SD card.

Next, open your USB drive on your computer. A dialog box may pop up asking what you want to do with the new hardware, in which case you should click "Open Folder to View Files." If a dialog box does not show up, you can go to the Start Menu, My Computer, and double click on "Removable Disk." You should see a folder titled "Music," but if not, just create your own.

3) Now, go again to the Start Menu and My Computer. Open whatever file contains your MP3 and music. This might be iTunes or just "Music." Highlight all the MP3s or music you want to have on your phone, and then drag it to the Music folder on the removable disk menu. It will take a few minutes for the transfer to complete.

To Unplug the USB Cable from Your Computer/Laptop and Android Phone

Once you have transferred the MP3 to your Android phone, click on the "Safely Remove Hardware" icon on the bottom right side of your computer screen. Click on "USB Mass Storage" and click the "Stop" button.

Then, on your phone, drag the menu bar down once again and you will see a dialog that says "Turn off USB storage." Click it and then you will see a prompt asking if you want to turn off the USB storage. Indicate that you do. It will now be safe for you to unhook the USB cord without damaging your computer, phone or files.

To listen to the MP3, go to the Music Application on your applications screen. Click on it and you can search for any MP3s you want to listen to now.
